ABOUT SPILF

Since 1978, Stanford Law students have worked to support public interest legal work. In 1992, the Foundation held its first annual Bid for Justice Auction, which raised more than just funds: It also increased awareness and community support for public interest work. For sixteen years, SPILF student board members have upheld the tradition of holding the auction to celebrate public interest and the students and lawyers who do it and support it. The Stanford community has increased its commitment, culminating in an auction that raised almost \$75,000 in 2008.

As SPILF has sought greater support from the broader Stanford and local communities, it has also sought to provide greater support, in innovative and timely ways, for the students and lawyers pursuing public interest work. To that end, SPILF has “seeded” many projects at the Law School, including Summer Funding and the Public Interest Lawyer of the Year Awards, both of which have now been adopted by the Law School and become institutions in the public interest community. SPILF currently contributes to outside grants, student summer stipends, legal service spring break trips and, most recently, our post-graduate fellowship.

STUDENT COUNTER-INJUSTICE INITIATIVES

SPILF currently funds student initiative involving public interest legal work. In 2008, SPILF contributed funding for travel and lodging expenses for students spending their Spring Break doing public interest legal work in New Orleans.

OUTSIDE PROJECT GRANTS

The Stanford Public Interest Law Foundation supported 6 non-profits in 2008, awarding nearly \$45,000 in grants to projects targeting a range of social problems in a variety of communities.

RULES OF ENGAGEMENT (AUCTION RULES)

SILENT AUCTION (ATRIUM, 2ND FLOOR)

The Silent Auction opens at 6:00 PM and is located upstairs on both floors of the administration building. Bidders will record their bids on bid sheets in front of each item. The minimum bid and minimum raise for each item are on the bid sheet by the item. To be valid, bids must comply with these minimums and be legible. Bidding constitutes a legal contract to purchase that silent auction item at the price you stated if your bid is the winning bid. The last (highest) valid bid entered prior to the section closing will be the winning bid.

LIVE AUCTION (KRESGE AUDITORIUM)

Live auction bidding begins at 8:00 PM. When bidding, please raise your hand to be identified. If a group is bidding on one item, please designate one person to place your combined bid. Auction items will be awarded to one purchaser only. A bid acknowledged by the auctioneer is a legal contract to purchase the item.
